#### VILLAGE CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS

Durham County Council are now making progress on spending the Story Homes S106 funding on environmental improvement schemes that were prioritised by the Stakeholder group in February.

The new bus shelters have been funded by the Public Transport team, whilst S106 money was used to demolish the old stone shelter and lay a new tarmac base. Costs and designs for the reconstruction of the original Pant [drinking fountain] within a new seating area opposite Rumi's will soon be known. This is the first priority of 6 schemes that were agreed by the Stakeholders. With sufficient funding, the second and third priorities are conservation street lighting then coping stones for the bed opposite the Golden Flower.

## 'BLOOMING' SHOTLEY BRIDGE

Summer judging for Northumbria in Bloom is on 21 July. Colourful bedding has been planted by the volunteers and the Trust has taken on responsibility for four planting beds in the village centre. More sustainable plants have been introduced and the bed opposite the Golden Flower takeaway has been planted with sunflowers. It will be planted with perennial shrubs in the autumn.

### **LAPEL BADGES**

The Trust is promoting Shotley Bridge and raising funds with these badges, which are on sale in the village for £2.
