AGM NOMINATIONS

RED KITES

The Trust has invited the 'Friends of Red Kites' [FoRK] to give an illustrated talk about their work and the magnificent red kites which are now often seen riding the air currents in the skies above the village.

VILLAGE CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS

The last two environmental improvement schemes are in progress, using S106 funding from the Story housing development site.

Paving and walling for the new seating area opposite Rumi's has been completed in readiness for the installation of seating and a replica Pant. The new conservation style street lighting posts and lamps are to be installed shortly.

NEIGHBOURHOOD GRANT

An application for funding from Durham County Council has been successful. Councillor's Oliver and Robinson have generously given £2500 each from their Neighbourhood Budget for Trust projects.

VILLAGE HERITAGE

The Heritage Group has started research into the history of the village. With the grant from DCC it will be able to purchase 4 new heritage plaques and publish a 32 page booklet. The Trust is looking to take part in 'Heritage Open Days' this September, with guided and self guided walks around the village. 'BLOOMING' SHOTLEY BRIDGE

The Northumbria in Bloom judges will be visiting on 20 July.

Two [double tier] oak barrel planters have been purchased with the grant from DCC. On 6 June volunteers will be filling these and the tubs with summer bedding. If you would like to join the 'Blooming' group or volunteer to look after tubs please ask.
