HERITAGE GROUP

Research is continuing into the history of the village. The Trust had a mixed response to its Heritage Walks programme during the Heritage Open Days weekend. The guided walks around the village were popular on the Sunday but Saturday was a little washed out!

VILLAGE CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS

Durham County Council have almost finished spending the S106 funding on environmental improvement schemes in the village centre. New seating and a litter bin have been installed in the new paved area opposite Rumi's and a replica Pant has been commissioned. This will look like the original that was erected at the corner of Front Street and Snows Green Road, to commemorate the bringing of a piped water supply to the village in 1886. All 5 conservation style street lighting posts and lamps are now in place but still need cabling and painting.
